Award Categories and Eligibility Criteria

The following points provide a broad overview of the characteristics of the successful awardees.

- If consensus is not reached the final decision will be made by the Principal (or her nominee).
- Awards may not be made each year.

Distinguished Young Alumnus (under 30)

Recognises young alumni (30 years or younger at the time of nomination) whose early accomplishments inspire and provide leadership to students and alumni.

Nominees must comply with all of the following eligibility criteria

- Recognises young alumni whose early accomplishments inspire others.
- Work, whether professional or volunteer, demonstrates a significant positive impact that has been felt by many - locally, nationally or internationally.
- Their accomplishments raise their profile and standing within their community and/ or bring greater recognition of their profession.
- Demonstrates leadership qualities in a variety of contexts that could include volunteerism or community work or through their profession.
- How are they an inspirational role model?

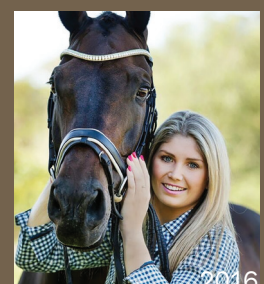

Caroline Amy Balguy (1833-1915)

Caroline Amy Alumni Award

Recognises the significant contributions made by St Aidan's alumni in their local communities and beyond.

Nominees must comply with all of the following eligibility criteria:

- Demonstrates sustained and significant contributions in one or more of the following areas: professional achievement, community, cultural, sporting or leadership achievement.
- Work, whether professional or volunteer, demonstrates a significant positive impact that has been felt by many.
- Through prominence in their field/ profession, brings distinction to St Aidan's.
- Has achieved sustained success over their career that is noteworthy and exceptional.
- How are they an inspirational role model?

Caroline Amy Balguy (1833-1915) founded The Society of the Sacred Advent in Brisbane in 1892.

Known as Sister Caroline Amy and, later, Mother Caroline, Caroline Amy Balguy started her religious life at the Community of St John Baptist in Clewer, England. She came to Australia on 9 December 1892 at the request of the Reverend Montagu John Stone-Wigg, Vicar and Canon Residentiary of St John's Pro-Cathedral, who saw the need for an Anglican religious order for women in Brisbane.

In its early days the Society of the Sacred Advent focused on ministering to the needs of women and children, establishing several schools and children's homes throughout Queensland. In 1895 the Sisters opened a boarding school for girls in Nundah, at the site of a former boys' school, known as Eton High School. On 8 July 1910, under the guidance of Mother Emma, the Sisters moved into their current residence at Community House in Albion.

How to Nominate

1. Complete the 2017 Nomination Form. If you are nominating one alumnus in multiple categories, please complete a separate nomination package.
2. Provide a current professional résumé/biography.
3. Provide a written statement (maximum 500 words) detailing why the nominee deserves to be recognised and how they meet the criteria for the award.
4. Nominations may also include supporting evidence: awards, media clippings, electronic media footage, etc. (maximum of 3 attachments).
5. Completed nominations must be received by 5 pm (AEST) FRIDAY 30 JUNE 2017
6. Any incomplete nominations or nominations submitted after the deadline will not be considered.

Conditions of Entry

1. An alumnus cannot win more than one award category in any calendar year and cannot win the same award category more than once.
2. Nominees must have completed their senior schooling at St Aidan's (although they may have left earlier than Year 12 or equivalent Form year).
3. Awards will not be awarded posthumously.
4. Joint nominations will not be accepted.
5. Nominations will be accepted from graduates of St Aidan's Anglican Girls' School
6. Alumni may nominate themselves or be nominated by another person.
7. Current members of St Aidan's School Council or St Aidan's Foundation are not eligible to be nominated.
8. The selection panel's decision is final on all matters relating to the nomination process and the selection of winners, and no correspondence will be entered into.
9. The selection panel reserves the right to select nominations to remain valid for up to two years. Nominators will be responsible for updating additional information.
10. The selection panel reserves the right not to allocate an award in one of the categories if, in their opinion, there are no entries of sufficient merit. The number of awards allocated in each category will be at the selection panel's discretion.
11. The School reserves the right to disclose the identity of the nominator to the nominee.
12. Personal information submitted to the School by the nominator or nominee, in connection with the awards, will be given to the selection panel for the purpose of judging the awards.
13. To avoid disappointment and to respect the privacy of those consulted, the nominations are confidential, and we ask that nominators and others involved maintain confidentiality.
14. The nominator's and /or winning nominee's name, image and statement may be published and/or used in any form of media, in any context pertaining to the awards.
15. Winners and their nominators, and all other nominators, will be personally contacted.
16. Award recipients may be announced in St Aidan's publications prior to the Annual Awards Night when award winners will be honoured.
